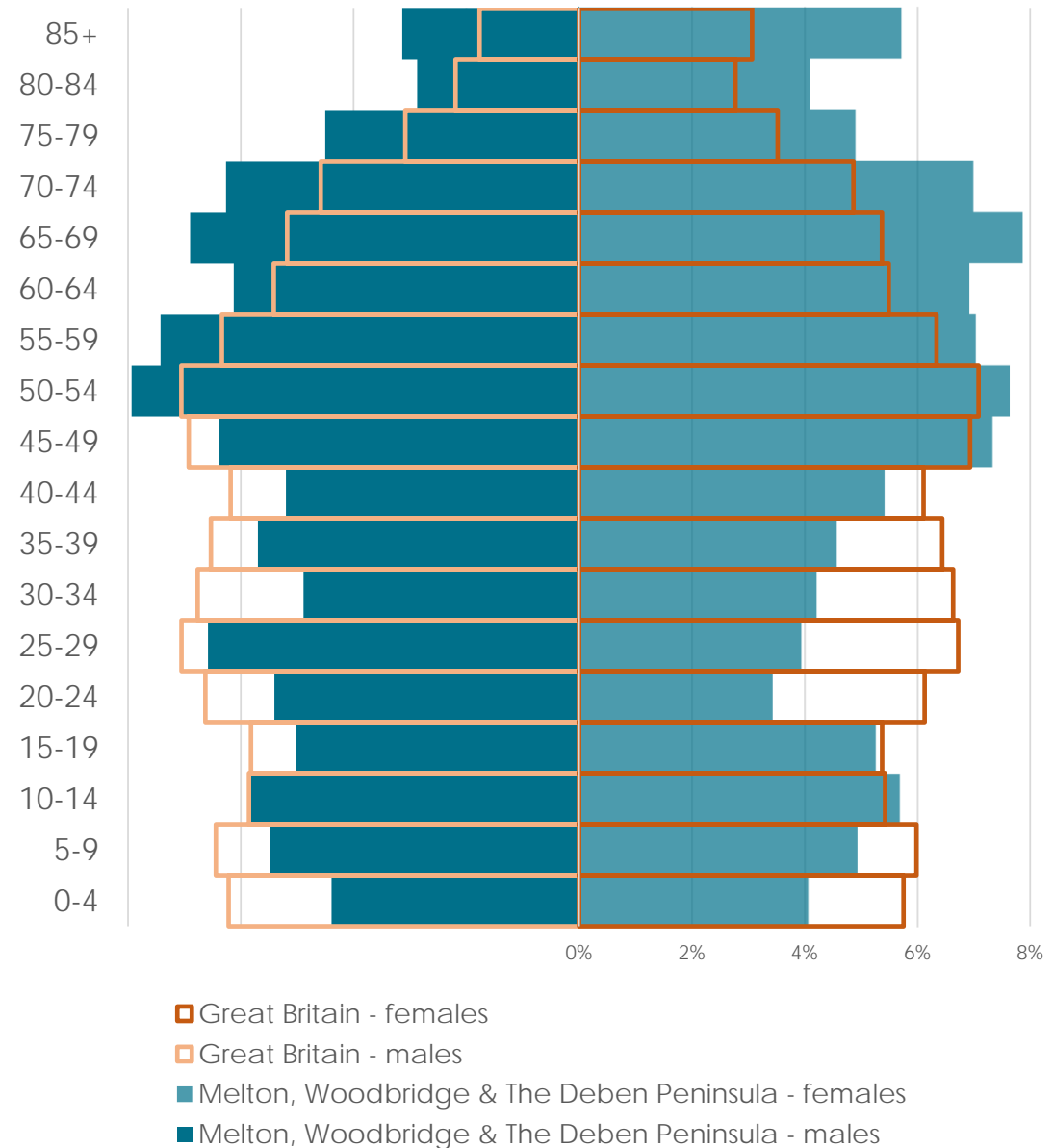
Population Age breakdown

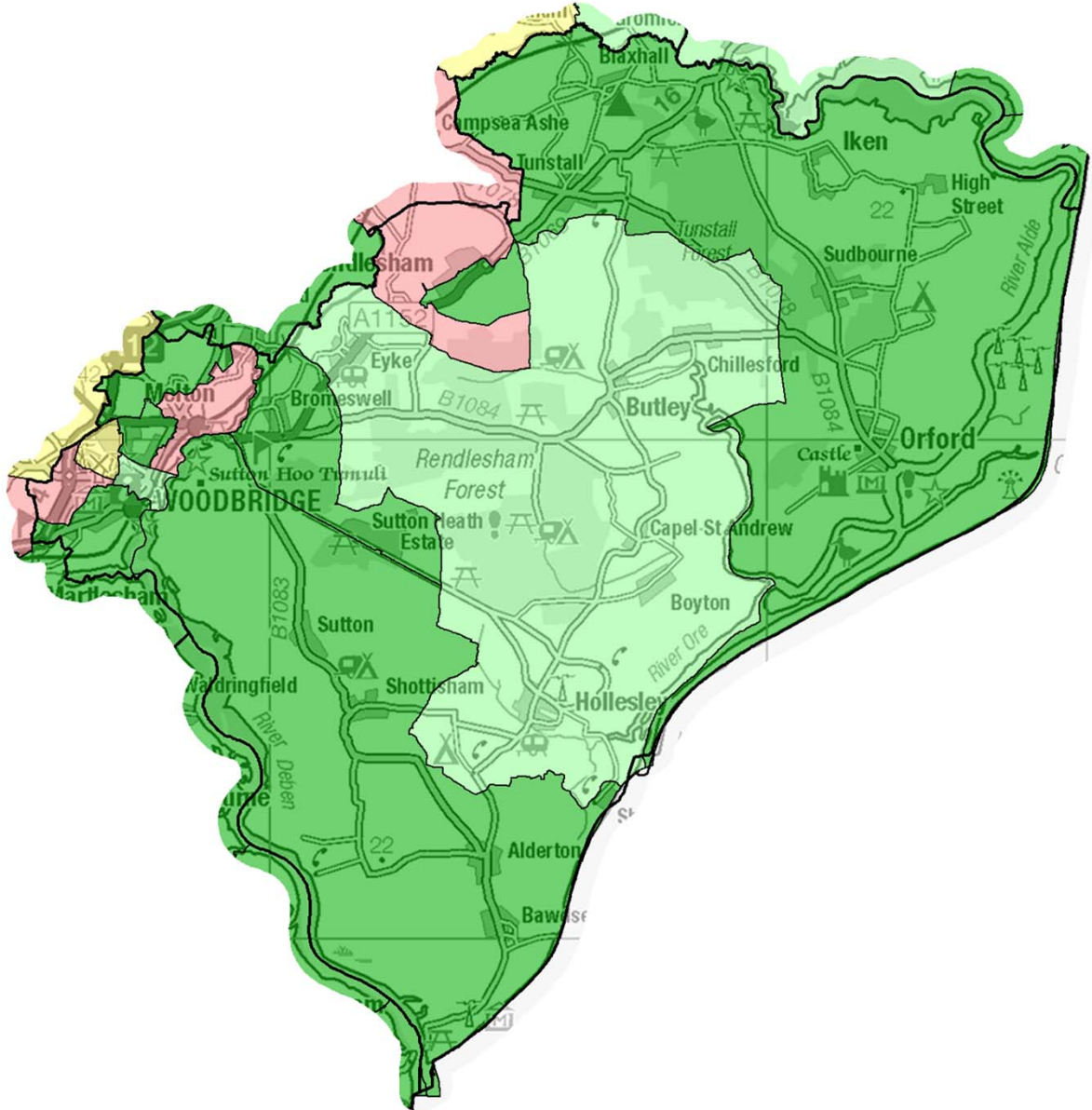

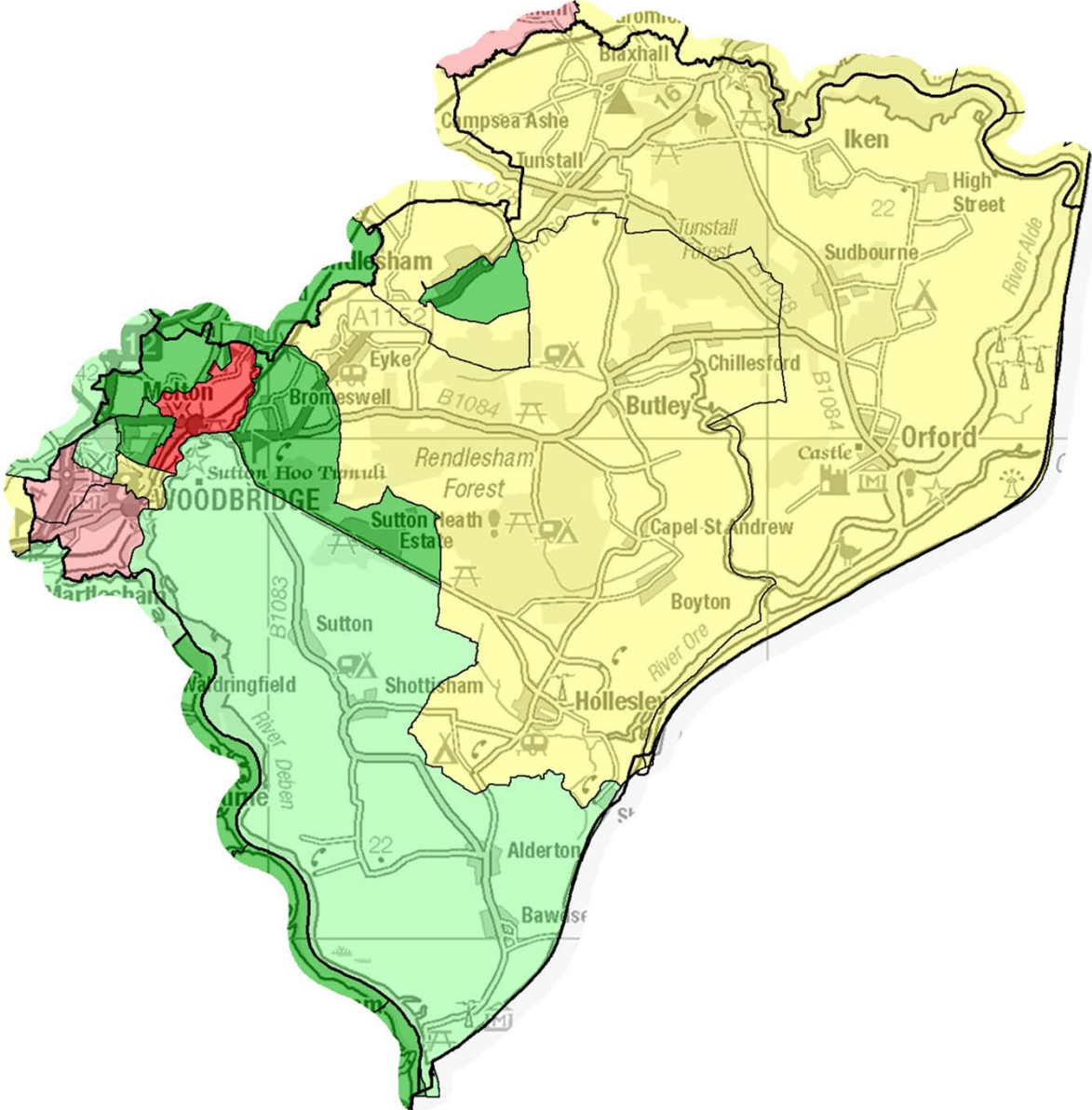

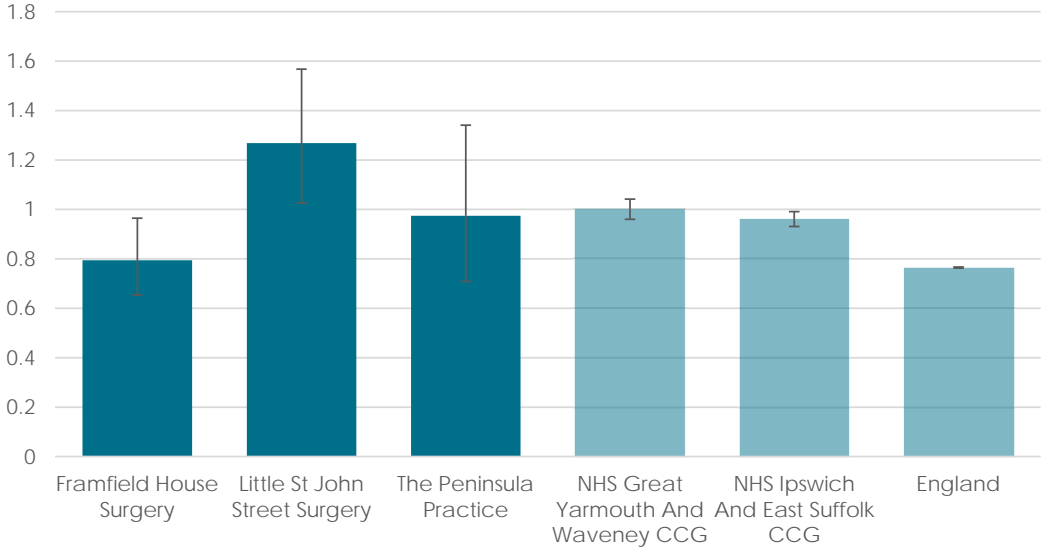

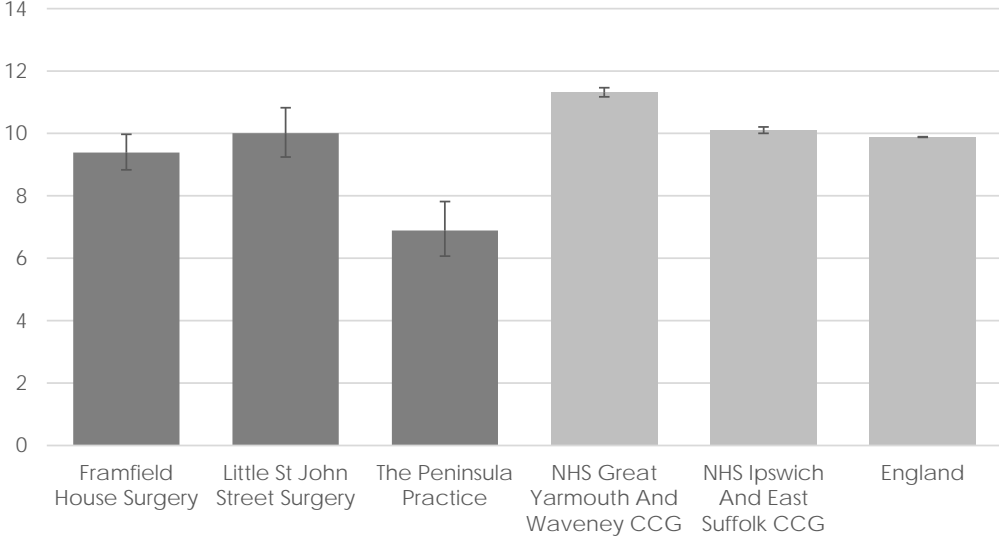

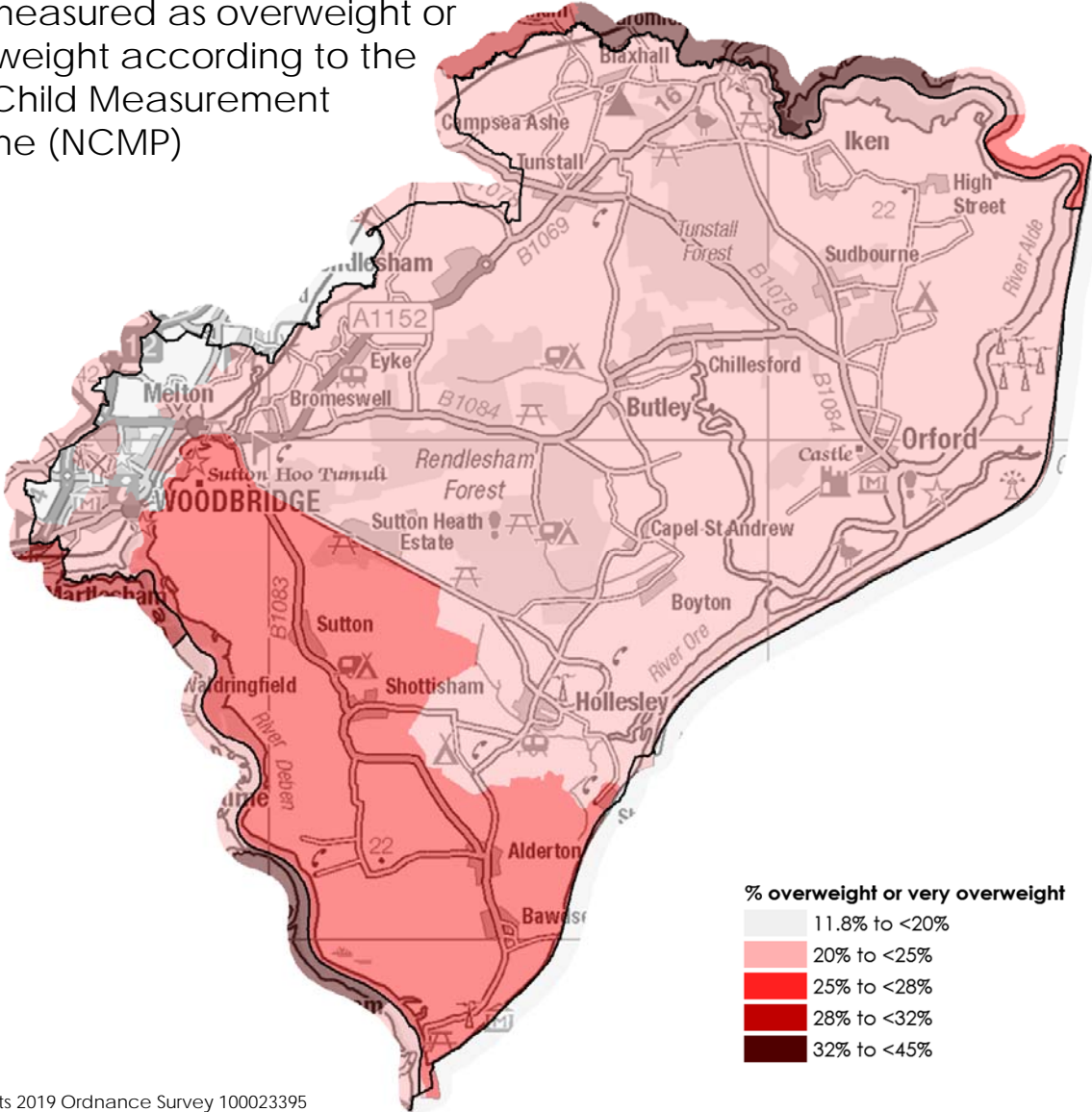

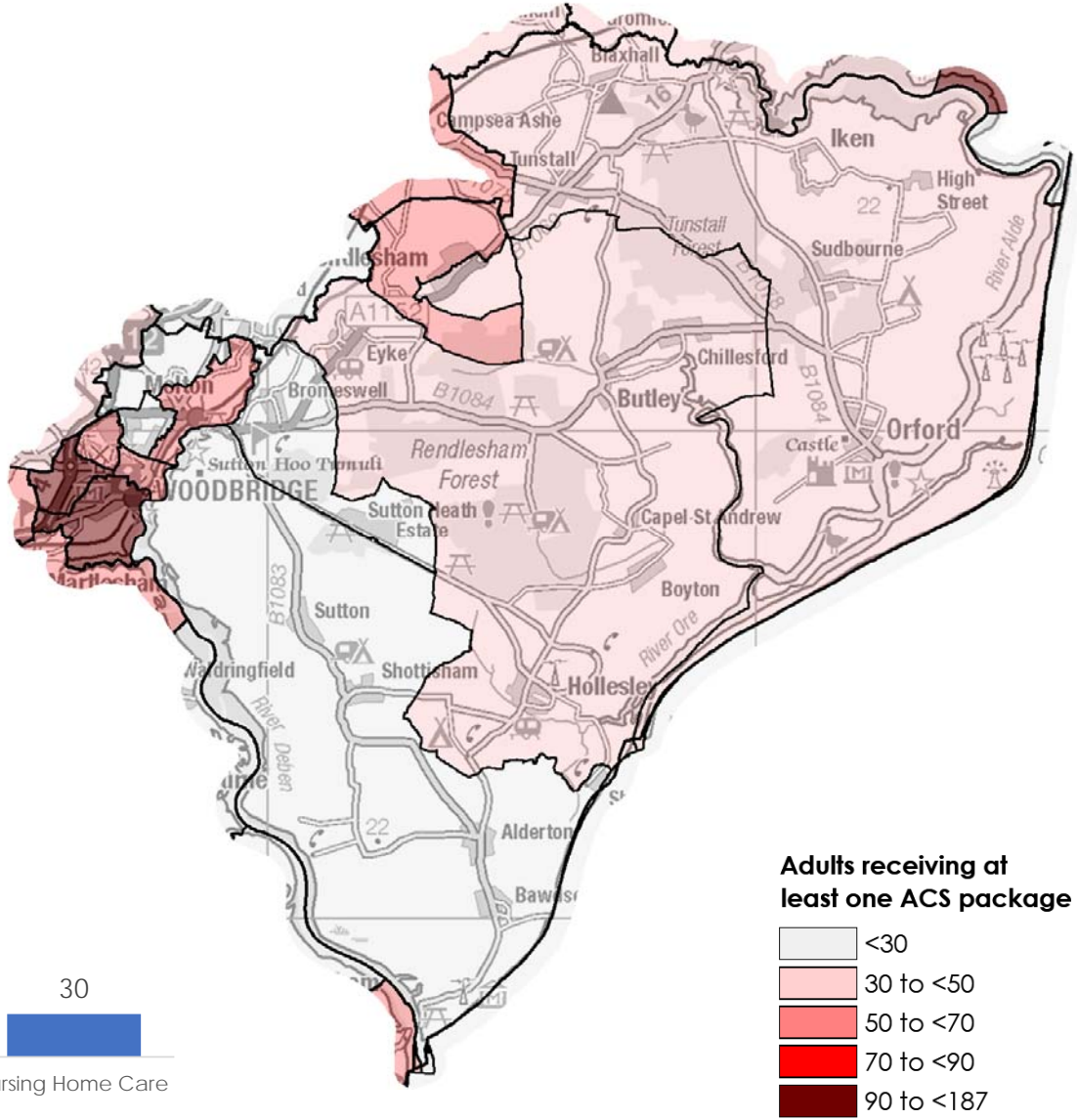

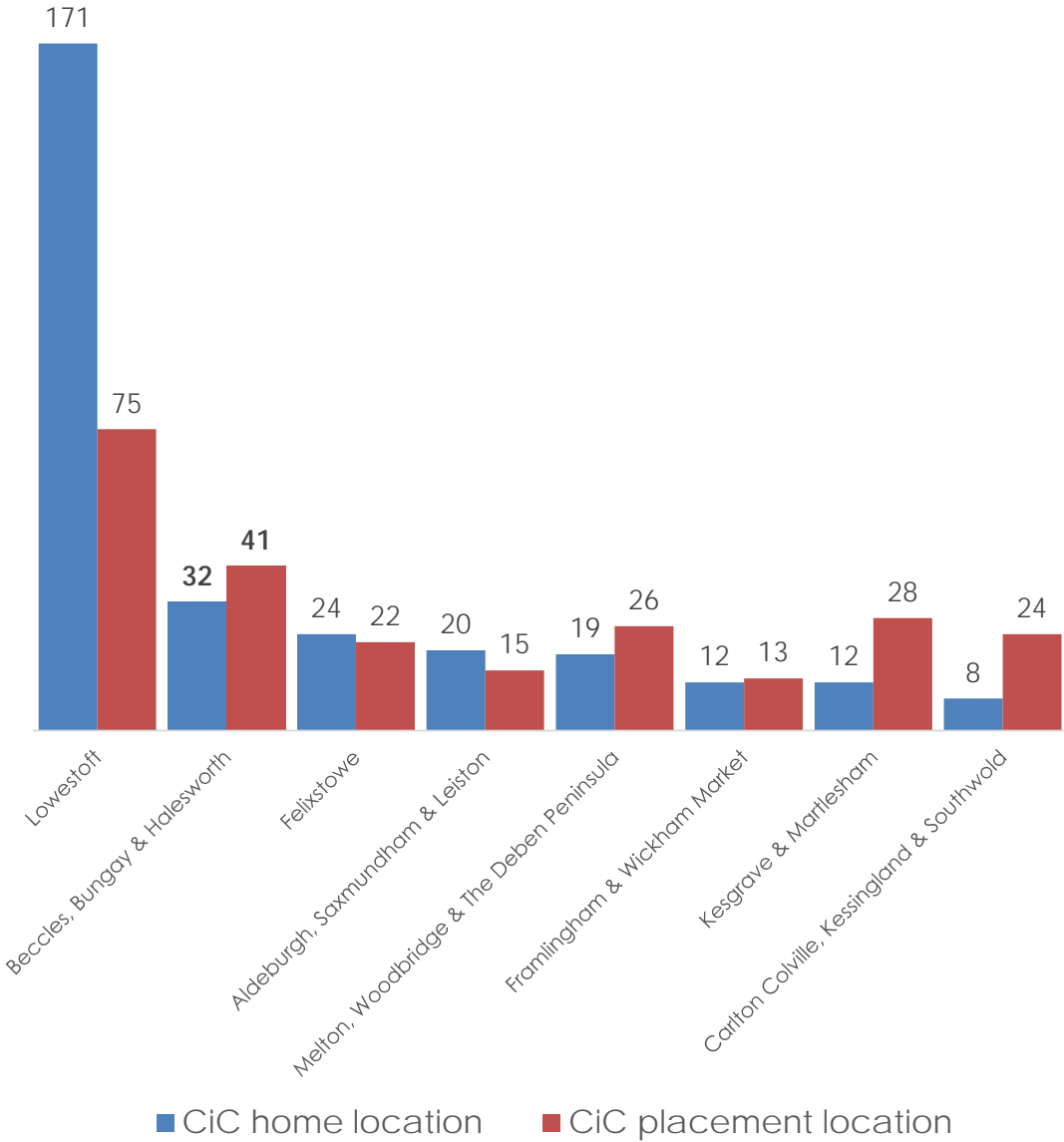

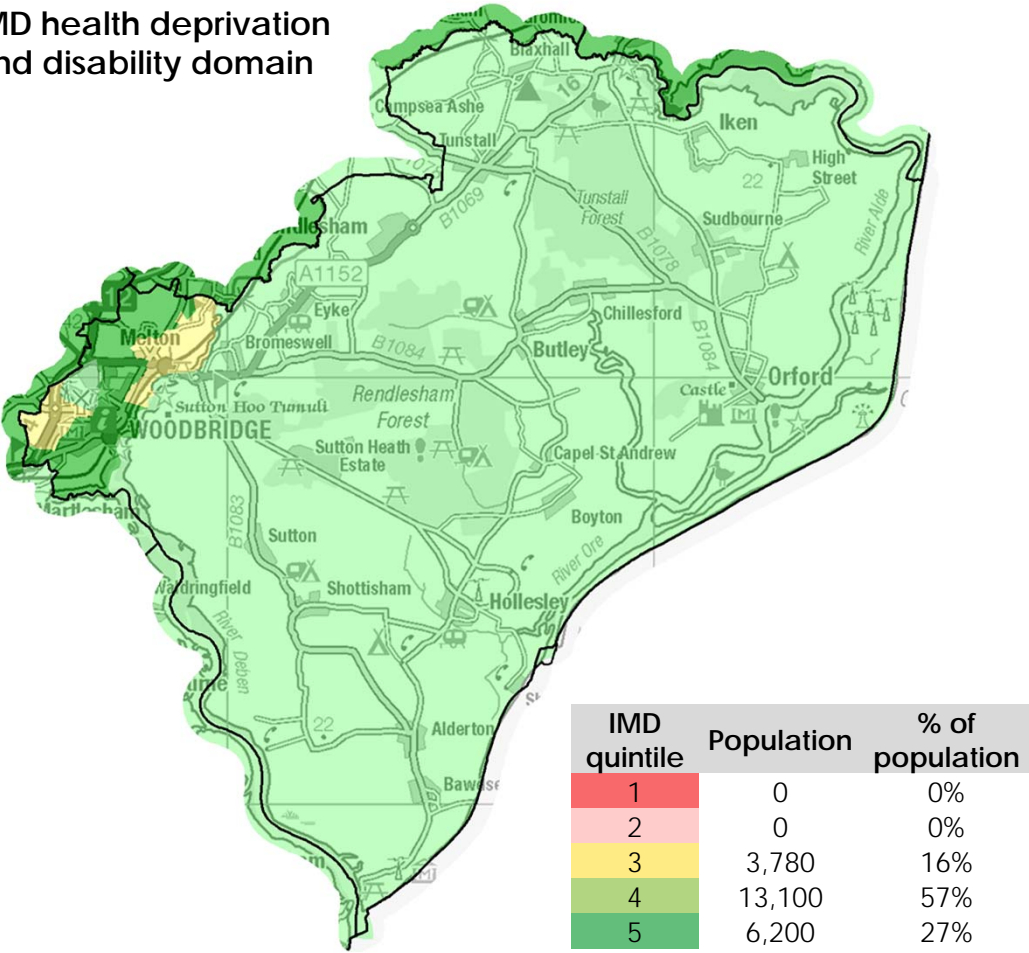

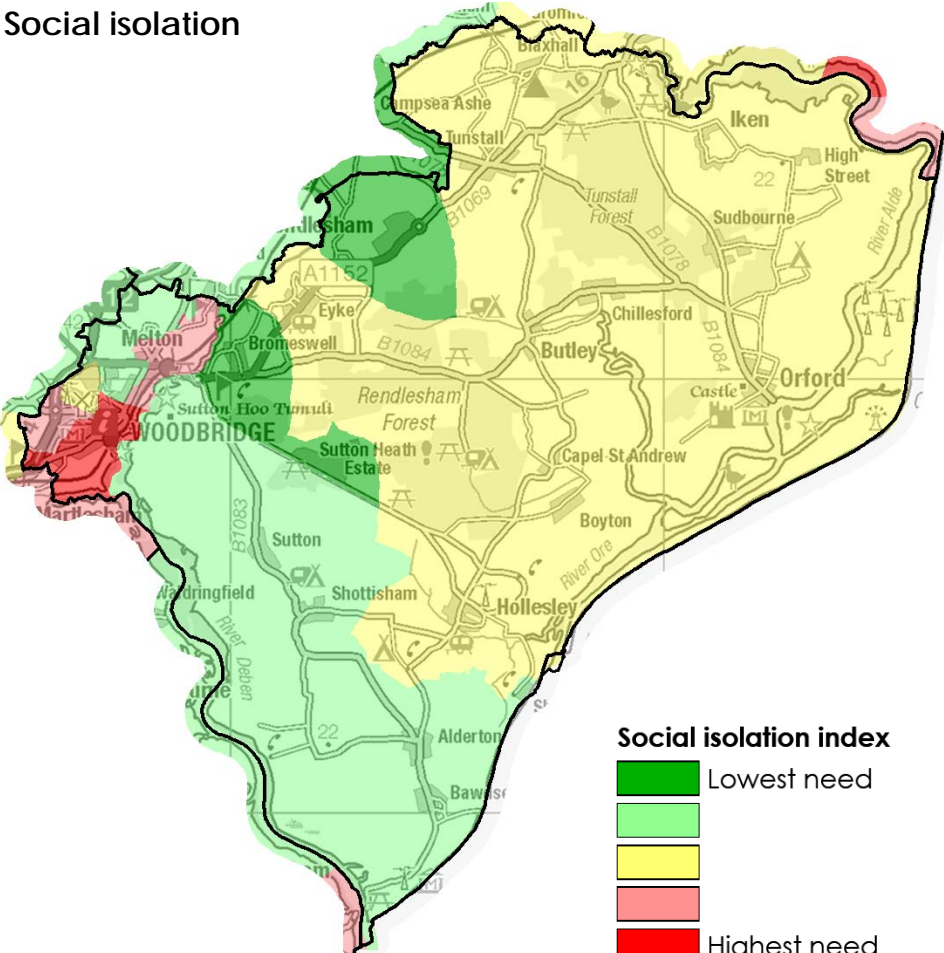

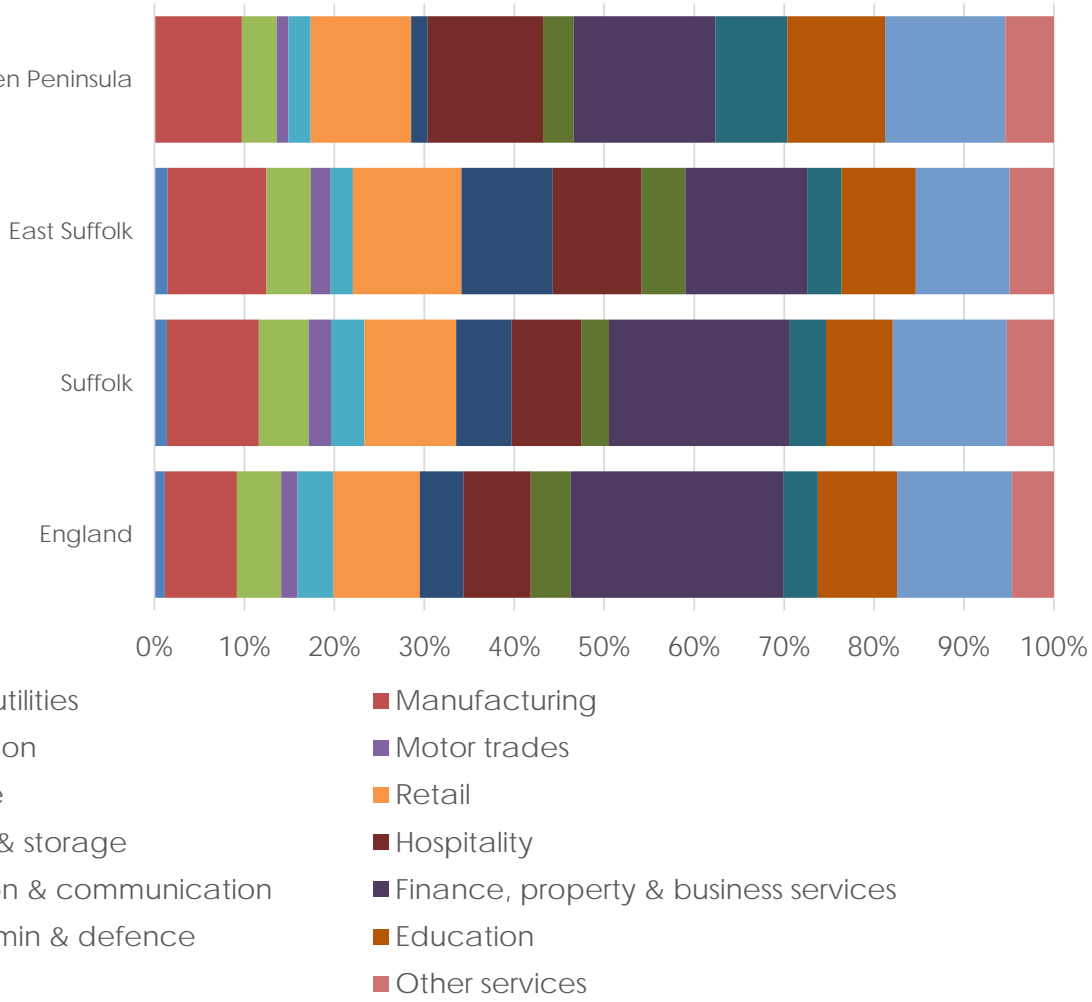

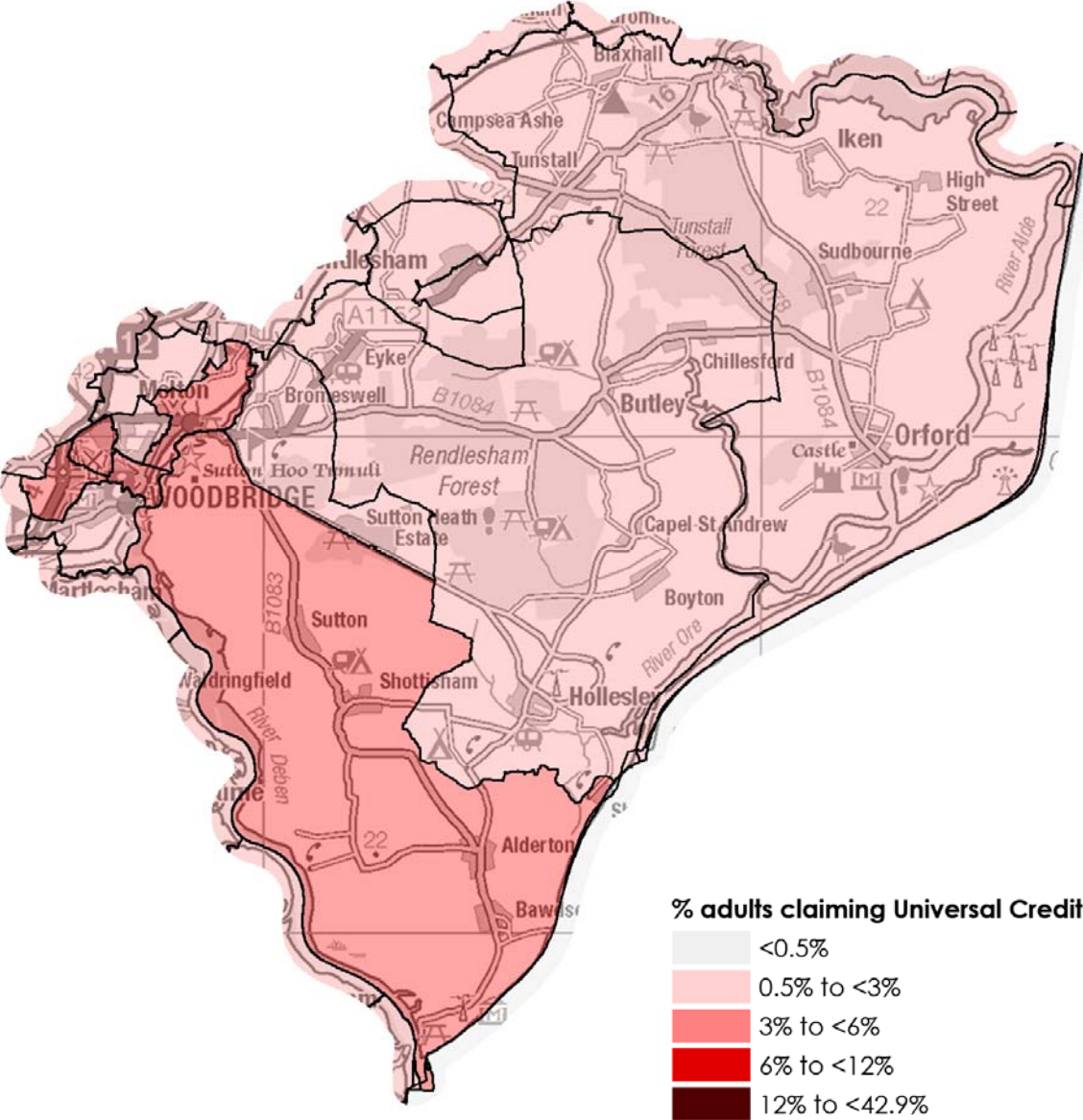

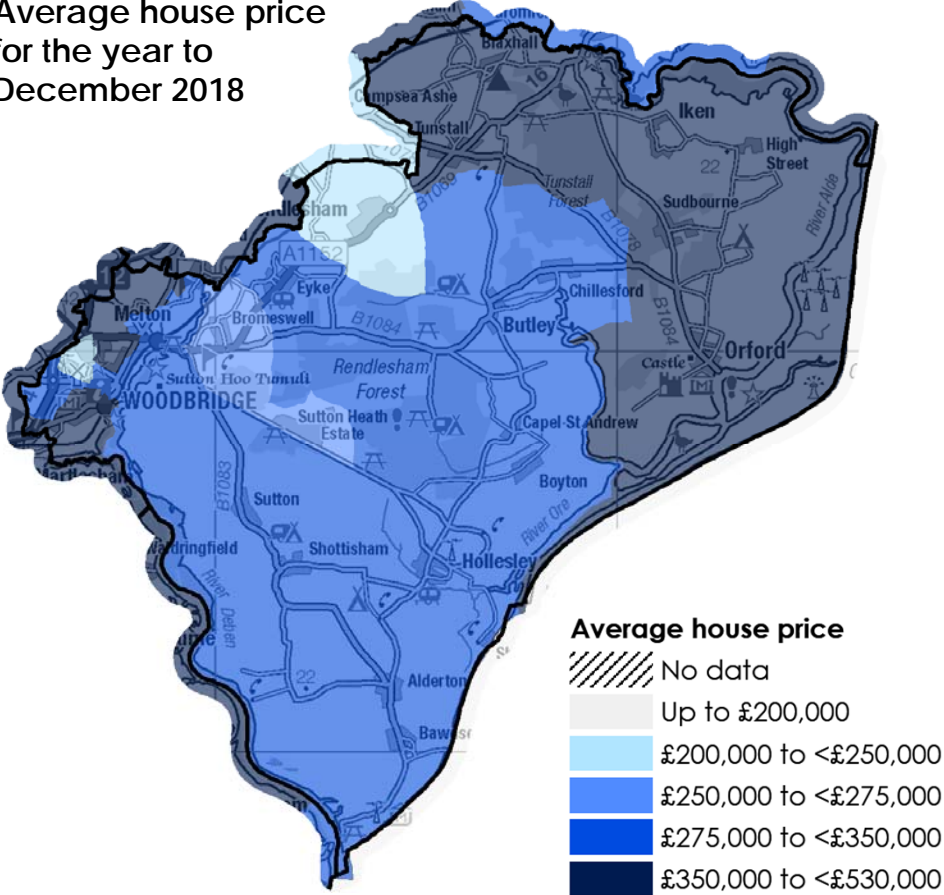

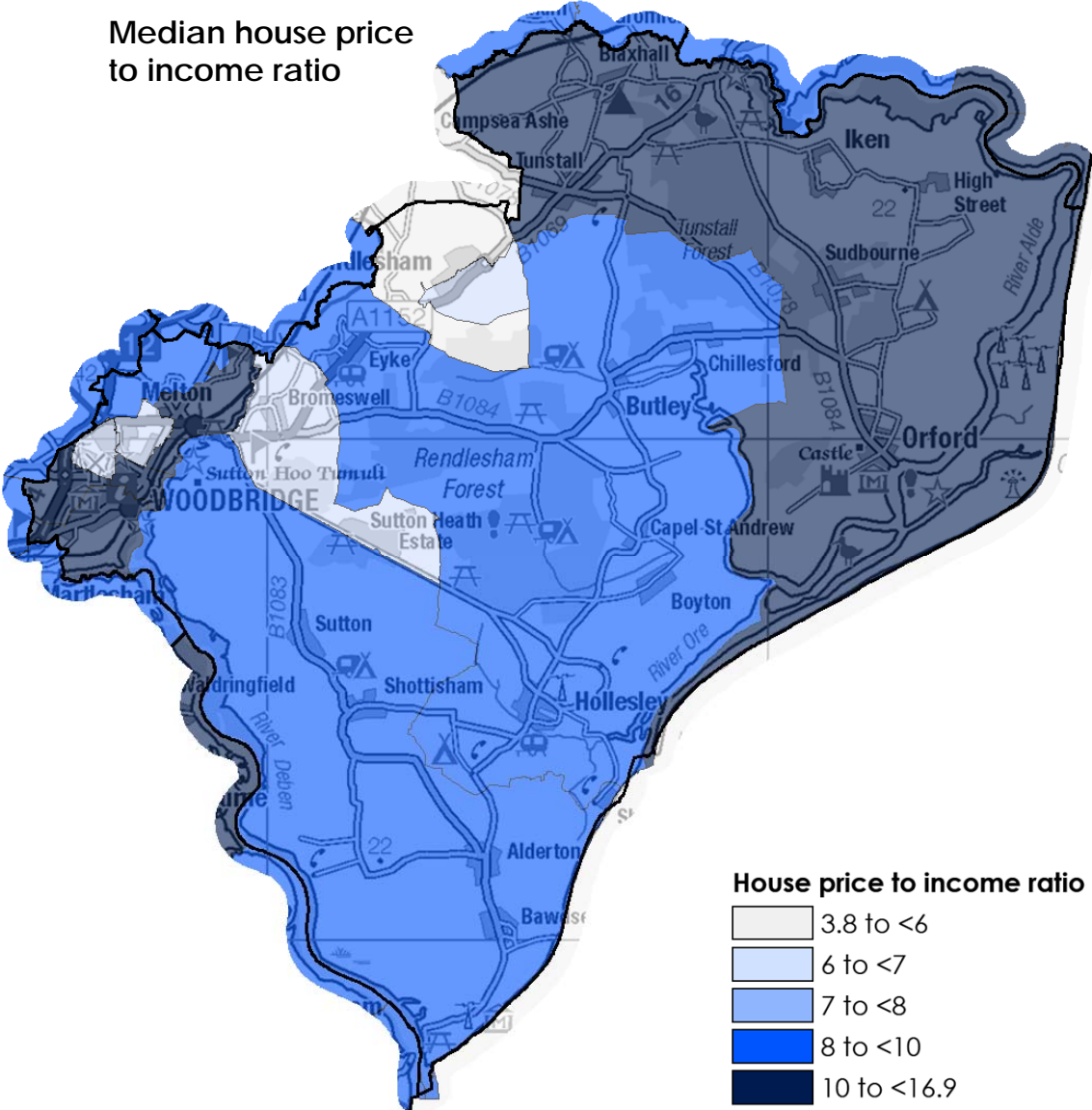

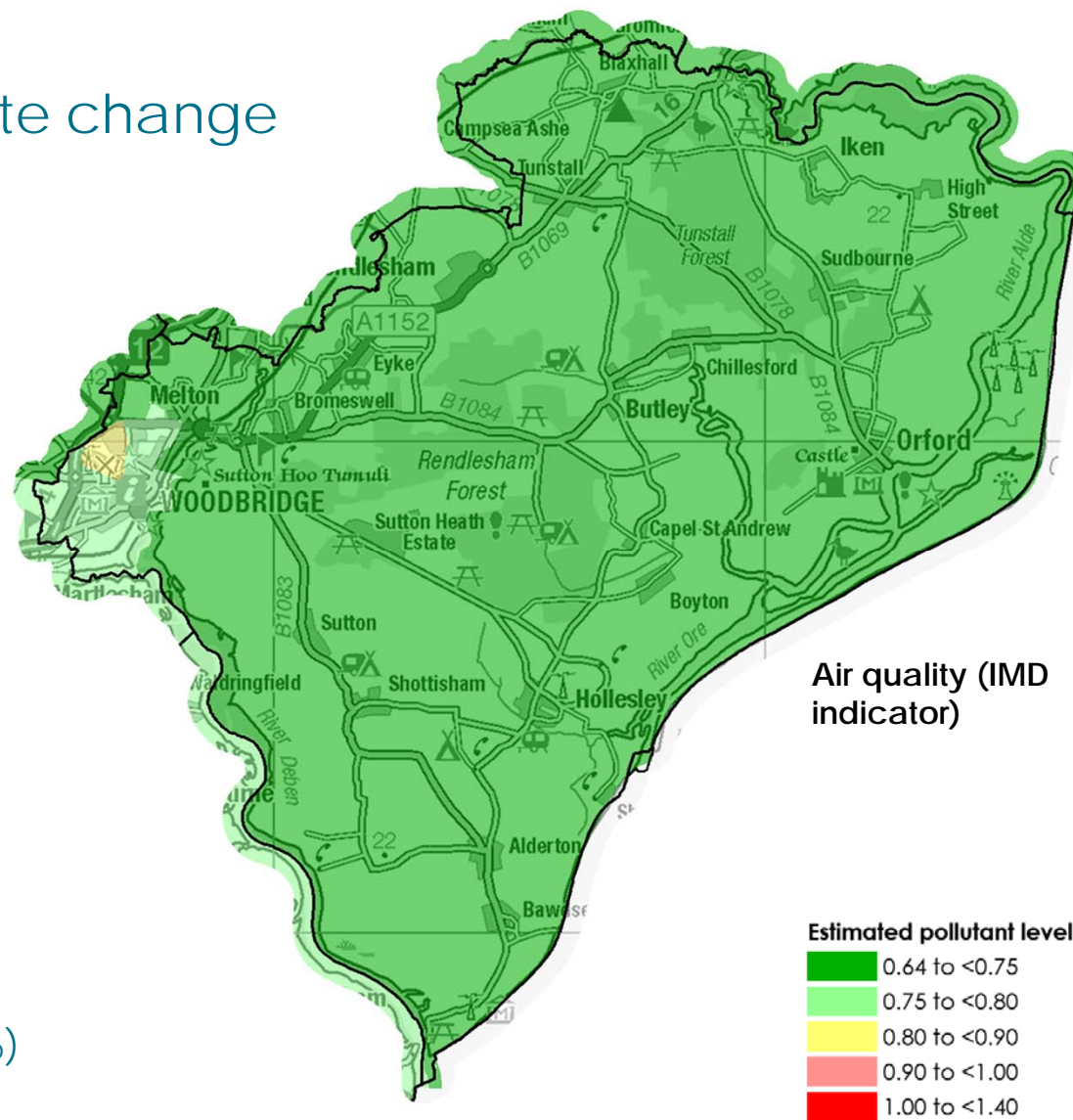

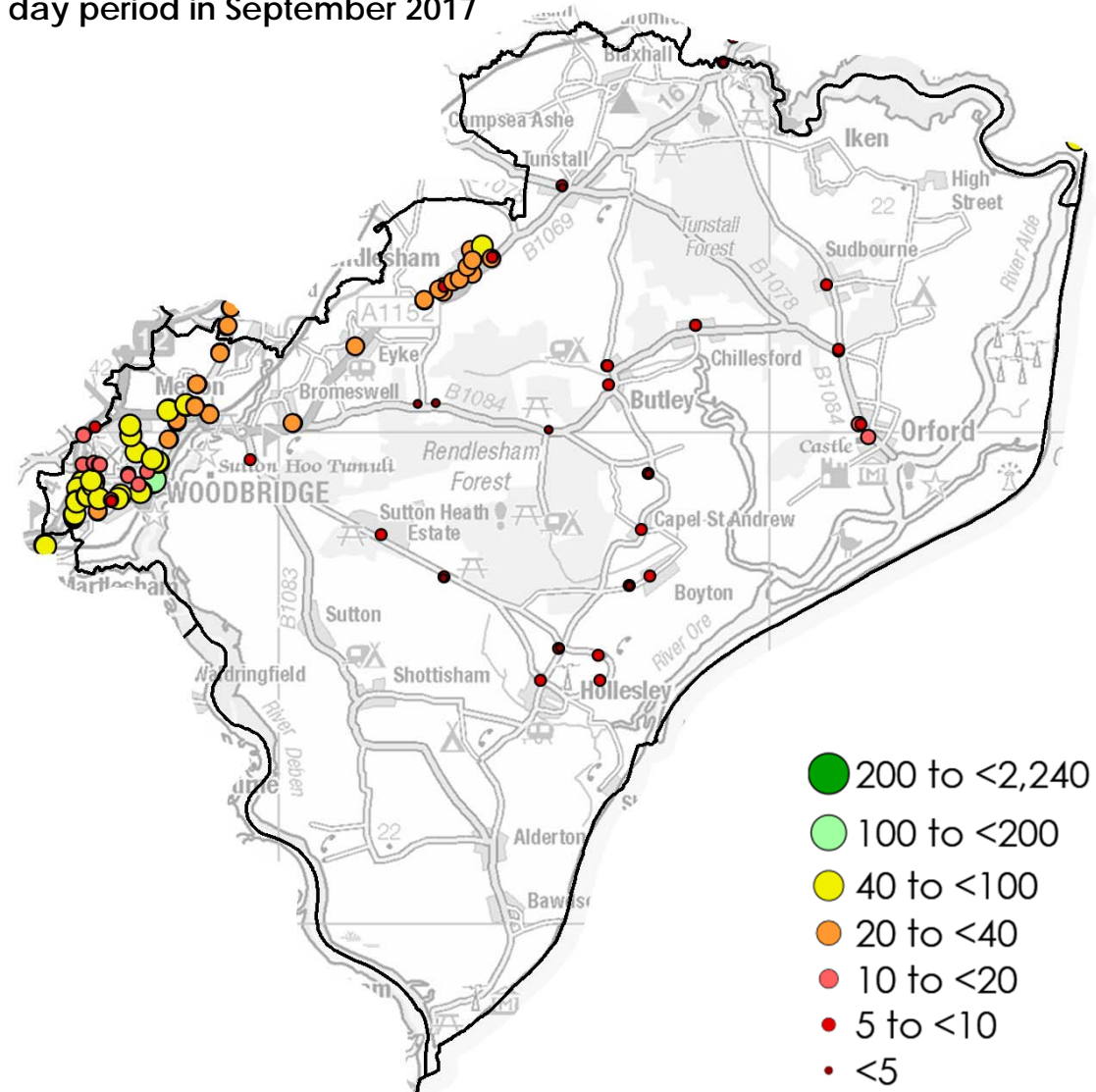
