Hall Farm Road Sports Ground

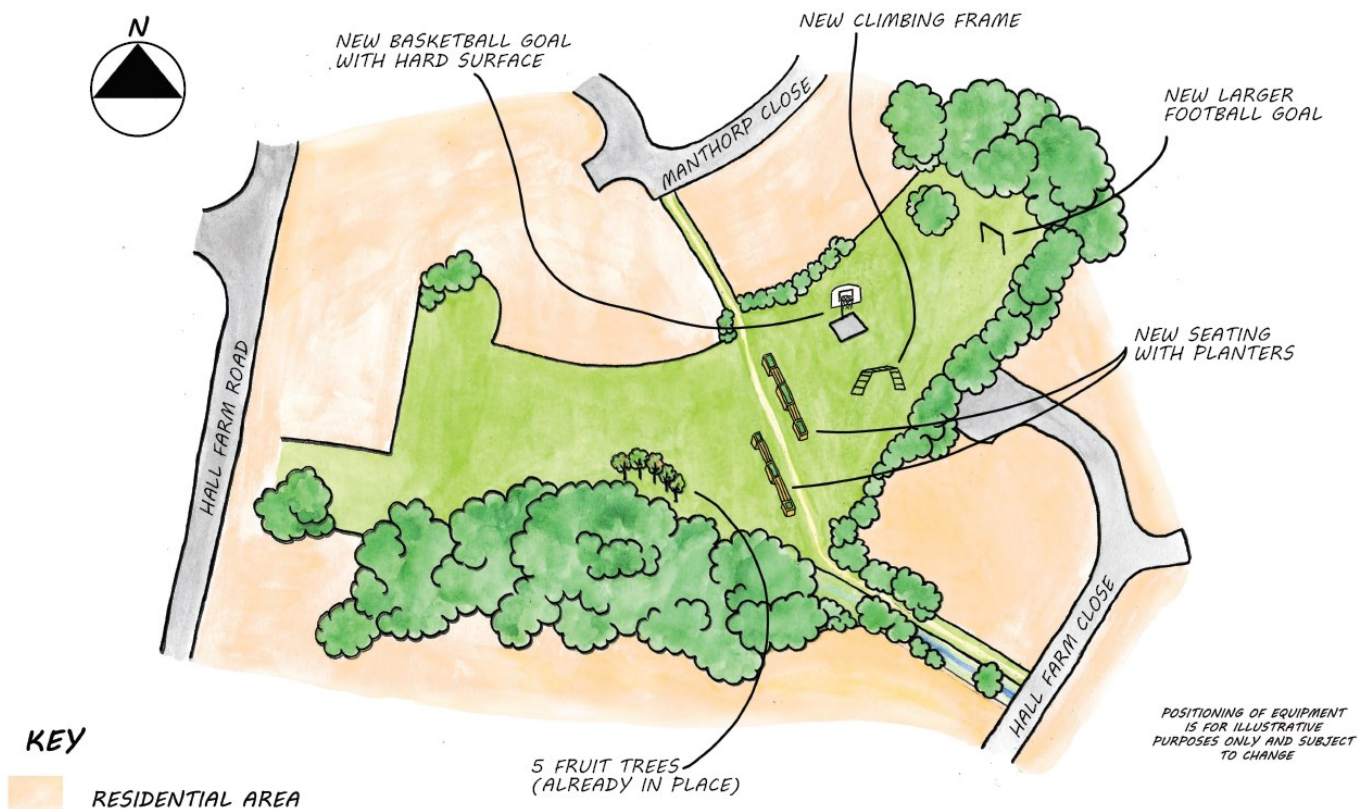
